DON'T WIDEN THE PLATE

I read an article several years ago about a 76 year old coach, John Scolinos, giving a speech at a coach's convention in Nashville. As the story goes, all levels of baseball coaches were present. Mr. Scolinos came on stage with Home Plate hanging on his chest.

He begin to ask each coach group, "How wide is Home Plate? Seventeen inches. How wide was it for Babe Ruth? Seventeen inches. How wide for Little League all the way to the Pros. Seventeen inches."

He asked "What do you do with a Little Leaguer or a Professional when they can't get the ball within that Seventeen inches. You move him or work to get him to throw the ball within the Seventeen inches. We don't change the rules just to fit the pitcher."

He went on to deal with the need in society to stick to the rules. He said, "If I am lucky, you will remember one thing from this old coach today. It is this: If we fail to hold ourselves to a higher standard, a standard of what we know to be right; if we fail to hold our spouses and our children to the same standard, if we are unwilling or unable to provide a consequence when they do not meet the standard, and if our schools and churches and our government fail to hold themselves accountable to those they serve, there is not one thing to look forward to....."

Coach Scolinos died in 2009. Just how much further down that road we've come since 2009. The last 10 years have seen us not only widen the plate, but shred it into something quite unrecognizable. Is it too late? We can feel the forces of evil trying to push us beyond the parameters we have set for ourselves as Americans and Christians. We see it in our national election process and in the doctrines of our Churches. Any means is permissive to achieve the end result desired by the Enemy. It is up to us to hold the line, and we must never, ever agree to widen the plate.

Jeremiah 17:10 "I the LORD search the heart and test the mind, to give every man according to his ways, according to the fruit of his deeds."

What a great story of truth. The church can do many different things to attract lost and unchurched folks to come hear the Gospel and participate. But we must never open up the Gospel to be changed just to help someone feel more comfortable or not be critical of us.

I've heard from some groups that the Church is creating problems for people because of its position on certain social issues. Some even accuse the Church of being the reason youth are doing some serious damage to their lives. I say, could it be that the Church is right and some folks are feeling guilty due to the working of the Holy Spirit and are damaging their lives from the guilt, not the position of the Church.

We need to hold to the things we know to be true and always be compassionate with those who disagree. We need to state our beliefs and put an arm around those who say they are hurt by our truth. Jesus was never cruel toward the unbeliever. The only folks he had harsh words for were those in the religious community who wanted to widen the plate, change God's standards to make themselves more comfortable.

We do need to get out of our historical boxes for ministry, but not out of our box for the truth. Don't widen the Plate of the Gospel, just to make someone comfortable.

This portable snack combines favorite fall flavors.




What you need:

- 1/4 cup maple syrup
- 1 tsp. pumpkin pie spice
- 1/8 tsp. salt
- $\frac{2}{3}$ cup pecan pieces
- ¹/₃ cup roasted pumpkin seeds
- 1/3 cup almonds
- ¹/₄ cup raisins
- 2/3 cup dried fruit (any)

What you do:

- 1. Microwave syrup, spices, seeds and nuts for 30 seconds at a time, stirring frequently, until mixture thickens.
- 2. Spread the mixture on a baking sheet lined with wax paper. Let cool and harden.
- 3. Break the candied nuts into chunks. Combine with dried fruit.
- 4. Store in airtight container.
